
Share your highs and lows of the day or discuss some of the questions from the FOUNCEYS FAITH TAIK.

# for the Home





### I. Faith Talk

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Share about a time when you were waiting for something or someone.
  Jesus said that one day he would return to our world with great power and glory.
- Is Jesus' return something you look forward to? Why?
- Jesus said, "my words will never pass away" (Mark 13:31). What words of Jesus are especially important to you?



#### 2. Devotional Practices

November 30 is the first Sunday in Advent. Using four blue or purple candles and a white centre candle set up a home Advent Wreath. In your household devotion times this week, light the first candle, and use the following words:

The first candle on our Advent Wreath is the PROPHECY CANDLE. Long ago God promised to send a Saviour. He used prophets like Isaiah, Jeremiah and Micah to give people hope for the future (light the first candle).

Have a household member read Isaiah 9:6. Then say this prayer together, repeating after the leader: Lord God, thank you for keeping the promises you made through the prophets and sending us a Saviour. Fill us with hope as we get ready to celebrate Jesus' birth. Amen.



### 3. Service

At Christmas time we remember that God gave himself in Christ to the world to save those who are poor in spirit. In response, we are called to give to help those less well-off. This week, begin to purchase non-perishable grocery items to donate to a local food pantry or charity serving needy people or families. Set aside a special box for these items and add to it each week of Advent. When it is full, wrap up your gift, attach a Christmas card and make your donation. Pray for those people it will assist.



# 4. Rituals and Traditions

With the beginning of the new church year in Advent, the church hears a new set of readings from the Bible (the main Gospel used this next year will be Mark). Gather together all the Bibles in your home and use this prayer of blessing:

Heavenly Father, we thank for you for the Bible, and especially for the good news about Jesus our Saviour. As we read, listen to and think about what the Bible says to us in this new church year, make us into people who are strong in our faith and full of love. Amen.
