### 3. Service

## 4. Rituals and Traditions

February 2 is the Church festival day for the Presentation of the Lord. The festival recalls that forty days after his birth, Jesus was presented at the temple in Jerusalem (Luke 2:22-40). This festival has also come to be known as Candlemas because of the tradition of blessing candles on this day for use in churches and homes throughout the year. This is associated with the Simeon's words about Jesus being "a light to reveal God to the nations" (Luke 2:32). Choose a new candle to light as part of your home devotional gatherings in the coming year. Say this prayer together: Lord God, thank you for giving us Jesus as a bright light in our lives. Bless us as we gather around this candle this year. May it remind us that Jesus is with us. Amen.

Light the candle and place it an open window for the evening ... but don't forget to blow it out before you go to bed!
