I. Faith Talk

Discuss in your household or small group:

- Share about a time when you felt at peace? What made you feel that way?
- The risen Jesus appeared to his disciples and said "peace be with you". What is the peace that Jesus gives?
- In what ways are you experiencing God's peace in your life at the moment?



2. Devotional Practices

John 20:19-31 tells us that Thomas found it hard to believe that Jesus had risen from the dead. Jesus responded by appearing to him and inviting Thomas to touch him. God's love is not turned away by our questions and doubts. In your household devotion times this week share questions and doubts you have about the Christian faith. Have each person complete this sentence: "Something I wonder about is …" Invite responses from different household members, and talk about ways in which you can explore your questions further. Be sure to respect and listen carefully to one another. Pray for one another, asking Jesus to come to you.



3. Service

Acts 4:32-34 says that the first followers of Jesus shared their belongings with one another, and made sure that no fellow Christians were needy. Is there someone in your church community who is need at this time – socially, emotionally or physically? Plan a way you can respond to that need as a household.



4. Rituals and Traditions

There is a long history of Christians sharing a sign of peace with one another in public worship, as a physical expression of the peace God gives to us through Jesus. The New Testament refers to Christians greeting each other with a "holy kiss" (e.g. Romans 16:16). Decide together on a sign of peace that you can share together as a household in daily life e.g. a special handshake, hug or kiss. As you share this sign with each other say, "The peace of the Lord Jesus be with you."
